**«DOMES 2010 AWARDS»
«Award for best built work for the years 2007 - 2009»
for GEK TERNA's Residential and Commercial Complex in Metaxourgeio**

Greek architects **Georgia Daskalakis** and **Yannis Papadopoulos** were donated the “**DOMES 2010 Award for best built work for the years 2007 – 2009**” for their work in **GEK TERNA's Residential and Commercial Complex in Metaxourgeio**.

The Award is part of the “**DOMES 2010**” initiative. The jury consisted of Messrs Constantine Decavallas, professor emeritus of the National Technical University, Athens, Dimitri Manikas, professor emeritus on the Academy of Applied Arts, Vienna and Alexander Tzonis, professor emeritus of the Technical University of Delft and professor at Tsinghua University, Beijing.

The complex is a high aesthetic contemporary residential building the architectural design of which has arisen from an international architectural competition (102 attendances from both Greece and abroad). It is developed in five (5) levels around a central atrium, and consists of 41 apartments and three (3) shops at the ground level by Myllerou Str. The building disposes four vertical circulation cores (both stairways and elevators) ensuring both easy access to the apartments and privacy for their inhabitants. Furthermore, there are two (2) underground levels in the Complex - the 2nd underground level used as a parking area and the 1st underground level where the storage rooms and a heated communal swimming pool is located.

GEK TERNA's complex is a unique residential proposal in the historical center of Athens and revives the sense of the old Athenian neighborhood offering tranquility, privacy and high standard downtown living.
